

## MinutesTown of Cary

Board MeetingJune 14, 2022

The regular Cary Town Board met on June 14,2022 at 6:00 PM. In attendance were Board members: Mark Gosh, Chairman, Dennis Brunner and Dale Zawislan, Supervisors; Jean Gansch, Clerk; Carey Rucker, Treasurer; Lori Hiebl, Deputy Clerk. There were 3 residents also present.

Checks were reviewed and signed.

Minutes of May's meeting were read and motion was made by Dennis Brunner to accept the minutes as read, seconded by Dale Zawislan, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report was given by Carey Rucker. Motion made by Dale Zawislan to file Treasurer's Report as given, seconded by Dennis Brunner, motion passed.

Treasurer's Information: Carey reported that the carry-over was \$103,225.46. This amount is from more than one year, it has accumulated over the years. Dennis suggested that the board not spend this too readily, it is good to have a cushion because we don't know what fuel prices are going to be this year.

### Public Input

Citizen Charlie brought his concern about the condition of Johnson Road—it was torn up by 4-wheelers over the weekend. Mark Gosh explained that he had informed the Wood County Sheriff's Department and they have a liaison officer who deals with ATV complaints in the County. Sargent Susa came out to investigate the complaint and discovered the name and address of the young man responsible for the damage to the road. The clerk will send an email to the Sargent requesting restitution in the amount of \$300.00 to be charged to the perpetrator.

### Road Report

Cary/Rock Road did not get graveled this year as scheduled because the other four roads took more loads of gravel than anticipated. Yetter Road took 93 loads instead of the 75 expected. This may have been because the drivers dumped the loads in a shorter run than they should have. Tim had a difficult time spreading the pile-up at times. Some of the problems with spreading out the gravel had to do with the rain fall on that day.

Board wants note to be included with payment to Bugar Trucking that there were some safety concerns with some of the drivers and that some loads were dumped in 55 feet that should have gone a whole 100 feet.
